- A. Palo Alto College procedures A 9.0 (Approval of Publications, Videos, & Advertising), and A 7.0 (ADA Statement on Publications), will be adhered toin the development of all college publications.
- B. College personnel overseeing the preparation of official college publicationswill ensure that all College publications accurately portray the conditions and opportunities available at Palo Alto College. College personnel overseeing the preparation of official college publications will ensure that in all cases where the Institution's status with SACSCOC is articulated, it is done in a manner that comports with the SACSCOC policy statement.
- C. The Vice President for Student Success in collaboration with the Office of Marketing and Strategic Communications, or a designee who is responsible for approving publications, will provide oversight in determining the appropriate recruitment materials that will include the SACSCOC accreditation statement. This review will occur prior to recruitment materials being published.
- D. The required statement will read as follows:
