

Question of the Issue: Which course modalities are the most popular given the changes during the Covid-19 instructional period?

A Wider Array of Course Modalities in Fall 2021

In Fall 2021, we saw an addition of an instructional modality in THECB methodolgy called "VideoTape/DVD/BroadcastTV." The course modality included all Zoom courses in Fall 2021. Though internal systems used "Zoom" or "Two-way Interactive Video" to describe these courses, the categories were condensed to match THECB designations. Overall, about the same number of fully distance education courses were available in Fall 2021 (582) as in Fall 2020 (539). Based on the increase in the number of Zoom courses (357) in Fall 2021, there were far fewer face to face courses (793). Students were more likely to take a fully distance education course because it had the greatest percentage of courses that stayed active. Hybrid/blended courses had the highest percentage of classes cancelled, at nearly 10% of the offerings being cancelled. Fall 2020 and Fall 2021 had a common result for hybrid/blended courses. Students preferred taking fully distance education courses over live Zoom courses.



A Term of Synchronous Instruction in the Middle of a Pandemic

Even though the pandemic began in March 2020, the subsequent Fall of 2020 remained strong with a majority of the courses registered as synchronous. As internal systems and state systems attempted to adjust to the various modalities which students received instruction, all synchronous courses were noted as face to face. Synchronous courses include any course where there were regularly assigned times where instructors and students met. In Fall 2020, Hybrid/Blended courses saw the largest ratio of cancelled courses, and face to face courses remained the most common course to be offered (1459 classes). The data show that most students desired either fully distance education courses and face to face courses over hybrid/blended courses. While the number of courses alone does not show desired course modality, the number of courses that were cancelled shows that some modalities were potentially less desired. Overall, SPC offered fewer fully distance education courses than face to face, but they both had about 95% of the courses remain active on the schedule.
