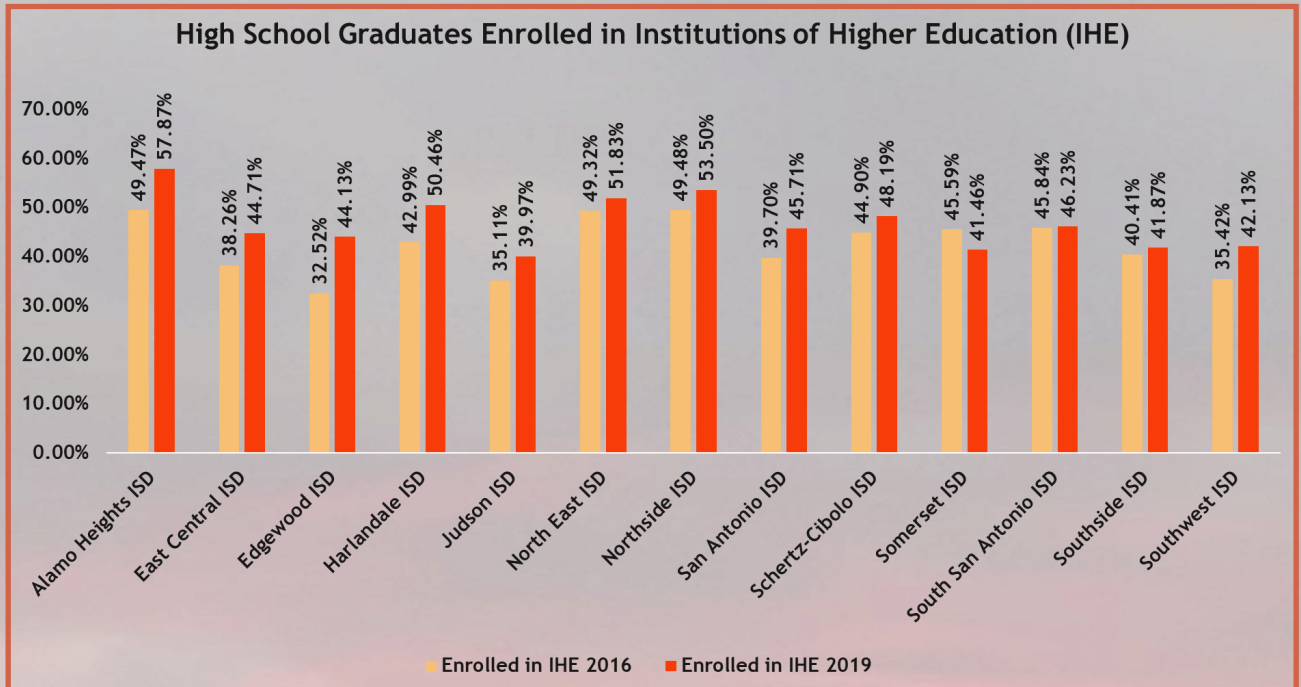


Figure 45-1 Higher education enrollment by high school graduates from San Antonio area independent school districts

Figure 45-1 (above) displays the percentage of area high school graduates in 2016 and 2019 who enrolled in an institution of higher education (IHE) the subsequent fall semester by independent school district (ISD). As shown, only one San Antonio-area ISD, Somerset, saw a decline in this enrollment in 2019 when compared to the 2016 percentage.

However, of the thirteen ISDs examined, nine remain below 50% IHE enrollment: East Central, Edgewood, Judson, San Antonio, Schertz-Cibolo, Somerset, South San Antonio, Southside, and Southwest. Only Alamo Heights, Harlandale, North East, and Northside exceeded 50% enrollment—a benchmark no district achieved in 2016, although Alamo Heights, North East, and Northside saw enrollment in the 49.0 to 49.5% range.

As displayed in *Figure 45-2*, compared to 2016 higher education enrollment percentages, only three of the SPC feeder high schools* demonstrated higher enrollment rates in 2019: Canyon, Memorial, and McCollum. Roosevelt and Highlands High Schools saw the greatest decline (>6%) in enrollment.

Dissimilarly, while overall enrollment in institutions of higher education decreased at the majority of these high schools, market participation at SPC increased at all but four of the high schools with the greatest improvement at Judson (>7%), Memorial (>5%), and McCollum (>5%). Brackenridge and Sam Houston showed the largest decline in SPC enrollment with >7% and >6%, respectively.
