

[HBCU conference at Huston-Tillotson University](#) in Austin, Texas, 1-2 April: Andrew Hill and Dr. Marie Feldmeier presented on SPC's engagement in the Intercollegiate Civil Disagreement Program (ICDP), a consortium of five colleges and universities in the U.S. (St. Philip's College, Harvard University, Stanford University, Santa Fe College, and California State University at Bakersfield) committed to **reducing polarization** by teaching students how to **connect across political difference.**" Eight student fellows from each college gather via Zoom two or three times a month for training in how to skillfully facilitate civil discourse. They develop expertise in facilitating conversation about controversial issues, including potentially divisive political issues.
