


Figure 29-1 3-year graduation rate comparison for full-time first-time in college (FTIC) students

As shown in Figure 29-1 (above), all Alamo Colleges District (ACD) institutions raised full-time 3-year graduation rates, with SPC achieving the second highest improvement (behind NLC) with a 15.9% increase between the fall 2011 and fall 2014 cohorts.




Figure 29-2 3-year graduation rate comparison for part-time FTIC students

The SPC 3-year part-time graduation rate also increased (3.4%) from the fall 2011 cohort to the fall 2013 cohort, but decreased 0.9% during the fall 2014 cohort (Figure 29-2, right).




Figure 29-3 4-year graduation rate comparison for FTIC students

The 4-year graduation rate shows vast improvement between 2016 and 2018 (fall cohorts 2012 and 2014) with a 16.2% increase, as seen in Figure 29-3 (right). SPC and ACD also show higher graduation rates than either Texas Community Colleges or all Texas 2-year institutions for academic year 2018 (fall 2014 cohort).

THECB graduation rate is defined: First-time, full-time entering degree-seeking students who enrolled in a minimum of 12 SCH their first fall semester who graduated from the same institution or another Texas public or independent institution.




Figure 29-4 4-year graduation rate comparison for full-time FTIC students




Figure 29-4 4-year graduation rate comparison for part-time FTIC students

As displayed in Figures 29-4 (above) and 29-5 (left), full- and part-time 4-year graduation rates increased between fall 2011 and fall 2013 cohorts, although SPC saw a slight decrease (0.5%) from 2011 to 2012 full-time fall cohorts.
