

GRADING SYSTEM

1. For all RADR courses, the following grading system will be used:

93 - 100 A

85 - 92 B

77 - 84 C

76 - 70 D

Below "70" - failure

2. To remain in good standing and to progress, students must maintain at least a "C" average in all Radiography course work.

Professional conduct is required of every Radiography Technologist student in the class-room, laboratory and clinical settings. A list of behaviors is included here for illustrative purposes only: not to be considered inclusive. Student conduct may be serious enough that the student may be placed on probation or expelled from the program. These are serious offenses of a moral and ethical nature. Probation for any reason will cause a reduction in the student's grade in the course. The highest grade that can be earned is a "C" for the semester's grade in the course where the infraction occurred. A student placed on probation may also be dropped from a course. Expulsion will cause a student to receive a grade of "F" in the course where the infraction occurred. Expulsion will mean that the student is out of the program for a minimum of one (1) year, OR dismissed from the program without eligibility to return. (See readmission policy.) Note: These disciplinary actions pertain to all RADR Courses.
