


Figure 17-1 Percentage of high school graduates enrolled in IHE for fall 2016 semester following spring 2016 graduation. Data Source: THECB

Bexar County School Districts

Figure 17-1 (above) provides an overview of college participation rates by Bexar County school districts. College participation is defined here as enrollment in an institute of higher education (IHE) for the fall semester following high school (spring) graduation, The data displayed reflects fall 2016 enrollment. As shown above, no Bexar County school districts achieved greater than 50% college enrollment, although Northside, Alamo Heights, and North East ISDs achieved greater than 49% participation.




Figure 17-2 Percentage of 2-Year IHE enrolled high school graduates at SPC for fall 2016 semester following spring 2016 graduation, Data Source: THECB




Figure 17-3 Percentage of high school graduates enrolled at IHE, 2-Year IHE, and SPC for fall 2016 semester following spring 2016 graduation. Data Source: THECB




Figure 17-4 Percentage of 2-Year IHE enrolled high school graduates at SPC for fall 2016 semester following spring 2016 graduation. Data Source: THECB




Figure 17-5 Percentage of high school graduates enrolled in IHE, 2-Year IHE, and SPC for fall 2016 semester following spring 2016 graduation. Data Source: THECB






Figure 17-7 Number of graduates enrolled in IHE, 2-year IHE, and SPC from high schools with less than 50% enrollment in higher education. Data Source: THECB
