About Career Management Skills

In this fully online learning experience, participants practice the skills needed to manage their careers, including:

- Learning about career options that fit with personal interests
- Searching and applying for jobs using the internet
- Creating a resume and cover letter with step-by-step instructions
- Practicing interview techniques and self-advocacy

A credentialed Alamo Colleges' Badge Coach facilitates the course, grades submissions, provides feedback, and assesses the demonstration of subcompetencies.

After completing this course, participants are awarded a digital badge called Career Management (CM). After earning the digital badge, they can share it to show that they have Career Management skills.

Career Management (CM) Competency*

Identify and articulate one's skills, strengths, knowledge, and experiences relevant to the position desired and career goals, and identify areas necessary for professional growth. The individual can navigate and explore job options, understand and take the steps needed to pursue opportunities, and understand how to self-advocate for opportunities in the workplace.

Career Management Badge

Participants who complete the Career Management learning experience earn a digital badge with the support of a live Badge Coach. The badge is shareable on social media sites, resumes, portfolios, and more. Each earned badge belongs to the earner and is stored in their virtual backpack hosted by Badgr, the digital badging platform of the Alamo Colleges District.

Participants in marketable skills training benefit by earning a verified digital credential that communicates in-demand skills.
